


What We Did Well




- 1. Built a national presence
 - Continued with monthly newsletters
 - Sent out press releases on behalf of the board and advocacy committee addressing important issues
 - Alberta de-listing
 - Newfoundland human rights legislation
 - Federal bill including Gender identity
 - Board members contacted by media to comment on a variety of issues
 - Travelled to several provinces to promote our organization as well as the member's promoting it in within their provinces



- 2. Advocacy versus activism
 - This was one of the challenges going forward from last year
 - We have allied ourselves with Egale on several occasions – the most important one being the Alberta SRS de-listing to form a stronger national voice (Egale represents the activism piece)
 - The Advocacy Committee was outstanding in this area



- 3. Membership Recruitment
- There was worry that membership would drop significantly with the institution of membership fees
- The Membership Committee proposed a fee structure that they felt would work after researching similar organizations
- membership dropped by 50% but still have 60 members




- 4. Providing leadership in trans health care education and provision

What Could Have Been Better




What we could have done better June 2008-June 2009 Activities
