
- 2010 to date

- Volunteer Executive Assistant

- 2010/11 strategic plans under development for each committee (50% complete)

- 153 today at 1300h
- Building case to join



Conference

- We have now held 2 mini and 2 major conferences under our belt!
- Lessons learned
 - Mini: ~10 registrants
 - Major: ~100 registrants
 - Simultaneous translation is expensive
 - It is essential to have a dedicated local organizing committee
- Conferences will continue

Development

- Decision to move towards a CPATH foundation pending Revenue Canada
- Will allow donations and the release of \$2,500 in community grants
- Need too plan ahead for new sponsors as the AZ FLH program will come to an end

Governance

- Ad hoc
- Not needed this year

Policy

- Has been used successfully to interpret and/or offer suggestions to the advocacy committee
- Recommends CPATH statements or policies to the board for approval

Education

- Successful in receiving a \$10,000 AZ grant
- Allows committee members to provide active support in regions of the country where it is needed
- Used to support the Community Forum

Research

- Popular committee
- Needs support to coordinating the broad interests of our members

Advocacy - presented by Marria Townsend

- Trans-Canadian
- Meet every 6 weeks
- Two areas of focus this year:
 - CPATH response to the DSM5
 - Surgical right of FtM in BC for phalloplasty and metoidioplasty via Human Rights board for a complainant against MSP; collaborating with CLAS; likely role for CPATH as intervenor

CPATH DSM5 response:

- ✓ Gender variance should not be considered a psychological disorder
- ✓ Legislation should be written that supports IDC coding to ensure care
- ✓ Children should


