Catherine was one of the six passengers who were killed in the float plane crash off the coast of Saturna Island on Sunday afternoon. She is survived by her spouse Ms. Shaira Holman.

Catherine was a social worker at Three Bridges Community Health Centre, a pioneer in primary care advocacy for vulnerable and marginalized persons, and an extraordinary advocate for the GLTBQ community both here in Vancouver and across the country.

Catherine was also the lead author of the *B.C Guidelines for Social and Medical Advocacy with Transgender People and their Loved Ones* and *Caring for Transgender Adolescents in BC: Suggested Guidelines.* These guidelines were subsequently adapted for international use and were published in the International Journal of Transgenderism.
